A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Health care in Manitoba has been undergoing significant changes including the establishment of Shared Health to centralize health-care services and programs province wide and the COVID-19 pandemic. COVID-19 shocked the health care system early in the year and continues to pose a threat to the residents of Manitoba. Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority has been extremely lucky to have received support in the form of food, supplies and both handmade and commercial personal protective equipment for our staff, patients and residents during the pandemic.

The Interlake Eastern Health Foundation's major focus over the past year was the Primary Care Centre and Clinical Teaching Unit capital campaign - a new building, adjacent to the Selkirk Regional Health Centre, which will allow us to teach medical learners in our region. Studies have shown that learners who are trained in a specific area tend to practice in that area after graduation, helping to eliminate physician shortages in the future. For the first time ever, the foundation was involved in an audit with BDO Canada, which was very informative and a great learning experience for myself and the board of directors. This past year our board of directors has matured and we are now operating at a capacity that has allowed us to grow as a foundation. Our board is made up of professional, forward-thinking people that see the value in the foundation now and into the future and I am excited about the direction we are moving in.

Thank you to all of our donors and community partners. We are so grateful for your ongoing support that benefits the health in our region. Our success going forward depends on strong community partnerships and working together to make the Interlake-Eastern health region a better place to live, work and play.

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Independent Auditor's Report

To the Board of Directors of Interlake-Eastern Health Foundation Inc.

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Interlake-Eastern Health Foundation Inc. ("Foundation"), which comprise the statement of financial position as at March 31, 2020, and the statement of changes in fund balances, the statement of operations and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Foundation as at March 31, 2020, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the Foundation in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Other Matter - Comparative Information

The financial statements of the Foundation for the year ended March 31, 2019 and the statement of financial position at April 1, 2018 are unaudited.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Foundation or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Foundation's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

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BDO Canada LLP, a Canadian limited liability partnership, is a member of BDO International Limited, a UK company limited by guarantee, and forms part of the international BDO network of independent member firms.



As part of an audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Foundation's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Foundation's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Foundation to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.



1. Nature of Operations

Interlake-Eastern Health Foundation Inc. (the "Foundation") was incorporated in 2015 under the Corporations Act of Manitoba. The Foundation was established to benefit the citizens of Interlake-Eastern health region by supporting health care needs in the region.

The Foundation is a registered charity and is classified as a public foundation for purposes of the Income Tax Act and accordingly is exempt from income taxes.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a) **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared using Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

b) **Fund Accounting**

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method of accounting for contributions.

The Unrestricted Fund relates to the Foundation's program delivery and administrative activities. No restrictions have been imposed by the donors or Board of Directors on these funds. These funds are managed in accordance with general Board policies and may be restricted only through Board of Directors motion.

Externally Restricted Funds represent contributions restricted by donors for the highest priority needs and for areas of interest. Board policy states that these funds must be spent within twenty-four months of receipt.

Endowment Funds represent contributions to be maintained in perpetuity and are comprised of funds subject to varying degrees of restriction on the use of capital and income. Unless specified by the donor, investment income earned on the Endowment Fund is reinvested in the Endowment Fund.

c) **Revenue Recognition**

Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the appropriate restricted fund when received or receivable. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue of the Unrestricted Fund in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Annual General Meeting sponsorships are recognized as revenue when the event occurs.

Contributions from the Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority (IERHA) are recognized as revenue when specific ancillary revenue is earned by IERHA if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Interest revenue is recognized as revenue in the period earned.

Other revenue is recognized as revenue in the period received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

d) **Contributed Services**

The Foundation is governed and supported by volunteers. Contributed services are not reflected in the financial statements due to the difficulty in determining their fair value.

The IERHA is committed to the Foundation and provides a staff person half-time, who serves as the Executive Director for the Foundation. The IERHA pays the Executive Director salary and benefits and provides office space, supplies and office equipment. The salary and benefits, office support and travel provided by the IERHA have not been recorded by the Foundation.

e) **Financial Instruments**

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value when acquired or issued. Financial assets are tested for impairment when changes in circumstances indicate the asset could be impaired. Transaction costs on the acquisition, sale or issue of financial instruments are expensed for those items remeasured at fair value at each statement of financial position date and charged to the financial instrument for those measured at amortized cost.

f) **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the year. Actual amounts could differ materially from those estimates.

3. First-time Adoption

Effective April 1, 2019, the Foundation adopted the requirements of the accounting framework, Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations ("ASNPO") of Part III of the requirements of the Chartered Professional Accountants Canada Handbook – Accounting. These are the Foundation's first financial statements prepared in accordance with this framework and the transitional provisions of Section 1501, First-time Adoption have been applied. Section 1501 requires retrospective application of the accounting standards with certain elective exemptions and mandatory exceptions. The accounting policies set out in Note 2 have been applied in preparing the financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2020, the comparative information presented in these financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2019 and in the preparation of an opening ASNPO statement of financial position at the date of transition of April 1, 2018.

4. Due (To) From Other Funds

The amounts due (to) from other funds bear no interest and have no set terms of repayment.

6. Deferred Contributions

The Pine Falls Health Auxiliary raised \$35,000 in prior years for the purchase of waiting room furniture for the Pine Falls Health Centre. Upon completion of the purchase, \$4,669 remained in the account. These funds have been restricted by the Board of Directors for cable and internet charges for the facility waiting room.

7. Economic Interest

Interlake-Eastern Regional Health Authority has an economic interest in the Foundation by virtue of its memorandum of understanding. IERHA states that all of its charitable donations received will be received in trust for the Foundation and forwarded monthly to the Foundation. Furthermore, specific ancillary services revenue received by IERHA is transferred on an annual basis to the Foundation.

8. Financial Instrument Risk Management

The Foundation, through its financial assets and liabilities, is exposed to various risks in the normal course of operations. The Foundation's objective in risk management is to optimize the risk return trade-off, within set limits, by applying integrated risk management and control strategies, policies and procedures throughout the Foundation's activities. The following analysis provides a measurement of those risks at year end.

Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk that the Foundation will incur a loss due to the failure by its debtors to meet their contractual obligations. Financial instruments that potentially subject the Foundation to significant concentrations of credit risk consist primarily of cash and accounts receivable. Cash and bank are held at a credit union with all deposits guaranteed. The Foundation is not exposed to significant credit risk as the accounts receivable are from IERHA and the government.

Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Foundation will not be able to meet its obligations as they fall due. The Foundation manages its working capital to maintain adequate levels of working capital to ensure all its obligations can be met when they fall due.

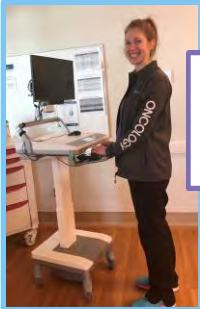

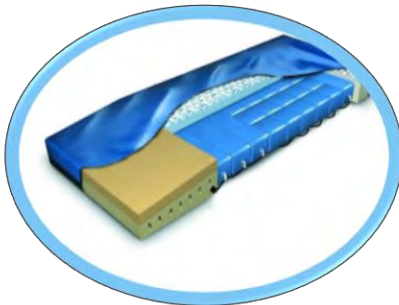
